In addition to Frazier, on the dais to pay tribute to Hart were good friend supermodel CINDY CRAWFORD, former *Entertainment Tonight* Executive Producer **LINDA BELL BLUE**, former *ET* colleague LEEZA GIBBONS (who called Mary her role model and mentor), political consultant and Fox News analyst FRANK LUNTZ, and comedy writer ROBERTA KENT (who helped write Hart's Las Vegas show decades ago).

Mary recalled, "When Entertainment Tonight first started, the entire "When Entertainment universe said that having a show on every night covering entertainment news wasn't going to work because there's not enough of that.

But low and behold, we started something."

Throughout the luncheon Perris presented clips with congratulations from celebrities and coworkers. TONY ORLANDO, Rabbi MARVIN HIER, and comedian TIM ALLEN offered heartfelt

"We were flying with President Ronald Reagan and I asked him to sign his autobiography to 'Mary and Burt.' Later we saw he signed it 'Maryanne Burt.' That's a gem, and that's so right about us, it's always Maryanne Burt."


